- 10. Define the rules of the assembly. There are 5.
- 11. What is the primary goal that summarizes 4 of the 5 rules?
- 12. Can women speak in bible class? Why or why not?
- 13. If some members are sick on Sunday morning, can we still have an assembly of the church? Why or why not?
- 14. How many people does it take to have an assembly of the church? What is the critical or key principle to answer this question?
- 15. If you are out of town and there is no faithful congregation to worship are you sinning by not attending services and not partaking of the Lord' Supper?
- 16. Is it scriptural for a few members of a local church (assume 10 members) meet together at one member's house on Sunday morning and partake of the Lord's Supper (i.e. and not attend the assembly)? Explain.
- 17. Is it scriptural for those same members, when out of town together, meet on Sunday to partake of the Lord's Supper rather than attending another congregation? Explain.
- 18. Is it scriptural to have split services (i.e. half the congregation assemble at 9am and the other half assembles at 11am on Sunday mornings)? Explain.
