

Little Ai, Big Problem



Achan's Iniquity

Was it wrong to send relatively few people?

- Scouting report: easy win, send a few
- Stunning upset for the Aiites; Joshua cries to God
- God reveals the reason for defeat (sin) & prescribes remedy
- What lessons can be learned here?
 - God sees everything
 - God held an entire population accountable for the sin of one
 - God does not appreciate being robbed
 - "I saw...I coveted...I took" (see Gen. 3:6; James 1:14-15)
- How do we reconcile family members' deaths with Deut. 24:16?

"...nor shall sons be put to death for their fathers; everyone will be put to death for his own sin."

Analogous Incidents

Defeat at Ai

- Followed resounding victory at Jericho
- Root cause was a hidden sin
- The sin was covetousness
- Capital punishment executed by Israel, witnessed by all
- Afterwards, success resumed


Ananias & Sapphira


- Followed the resounding success of Pentecost
- Root cause was a hidden sin
- The sin was greed
- Capital punishment executed by God, witnessed by many
- Afterwards, success resumed


God is making a point early on

Avenging Israel

- "Do not fear or be dismayed" (8:1)
- Troops positioned west of Ai (8:9,13)
- Joshua approaches from north, across valley (8:11,13)
- Ai & Bethel attack; Joshua retreats (8:14-17)
- Joshua stretches out javelin as a signal (8:18)
- Rear guard invades unprotected Ai; starts fire (8:19-20)
- Joshua reverses field, confronts enemies (8:21)
- Ambush troops close from behind (8:22)







Annihilation & Incineration

- Joshua's javelin remained outstretched; is that significant?
 - Similar to Exo. 17:11-13; God is in control of battle
- 12,000 fatalities (may include Bethel also)
- City burned to a heap (Ai = "heap")
- People allowed to keep livestock and material goods (8:2,27)
- King hanged until sundown, then unceremoniously dumped



Approvals & Imprecations

- Israel carrie yut Moses' instructions from Deut. 27-28
- Altar of ur cut nes built on Mount Ebal
- Other large stone: corked with lime plaster (27:4)
- Law was written on the platter (27:8)
- Israel distributes between Ebal 5.77 im to recite blessings & curses (27:11-13)
- Joshua reads Law to everyone (8:35)
- With this ceremony, Israel lays claim to their land.






Man Communicates to God

Appropriate Idea

- Why would God send them all the way up there for this?
- Shechem was where God promised land to Abram (Gen. 12:6-7)
 - Jacob's well was there (Gen. 33:18-20 + John 4:6)
 - Joseph's bones were buried there (Josh. 24:32)
- The two mountains form a natural amphitheater
