

Age-13 Bar Mitzvah

bar mitz·vah

["son of the commandments"]

the religious initiation ceremony of a Jewish boy who has reached the age of 13 and is regarded as ready to observe religious precepts and eligible to take part in public worship.

Girls age-12 Bat Mitzvah

Age of Accountability



bat mitz·vah

["daughter of the commandments"]
a religious initiation ceremony for a Jewish
girl aged twelve years and one day,
regarded as the age of religious maturity.
(Tied to the beginning of puberty.)

Puberty (defined) - pu·ber·ty

the time during which adolescents reach sexual maturity - capable of reproduction brought on by sex hormones - maturing of the reproductive organs – (girls) ovaries; blood discharge (representing adjustment of the uterus) – (boys) (facial hair) the age at which puberty occurs often construed legally as 14 in boys and 12 in girls

Bar/Bat Mitzvahs are at the age of 13 and 12 because Jewish law states that is when they should be held. At this age young Jews are seen as entering into adulthood and becoming members of the Jewish community, and they are then seen as responsible for their actions.
