“⁶ So He *came to Simon Peter. He *said to Him, “Lord, do You wash my feet?” ⁷ Jesus answered and said to him, “What I do you do not realize now, but you will understand hereafter.” ⁸ Peter *said to Him, “Never shall You wash my feet!” Jesus answered him, “If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me.””

“¹¹ For He knew the one who was betraying Him; for this reason He said, “**Not all of you are clean.**” ¹² So when He had washed their feet, and taken His garments and reclined at the table again, He said to them, “**Do you know what I have done to you?**””

“¹³ You call Me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. ¹⁴ If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. ¹⁵ For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you.”
